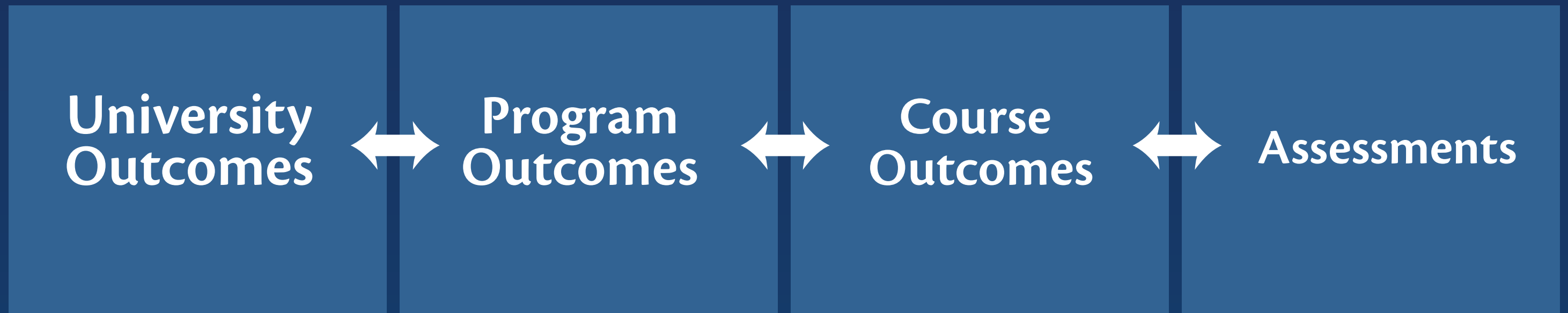


The Evolution of Learning Outcomes Management at BYU

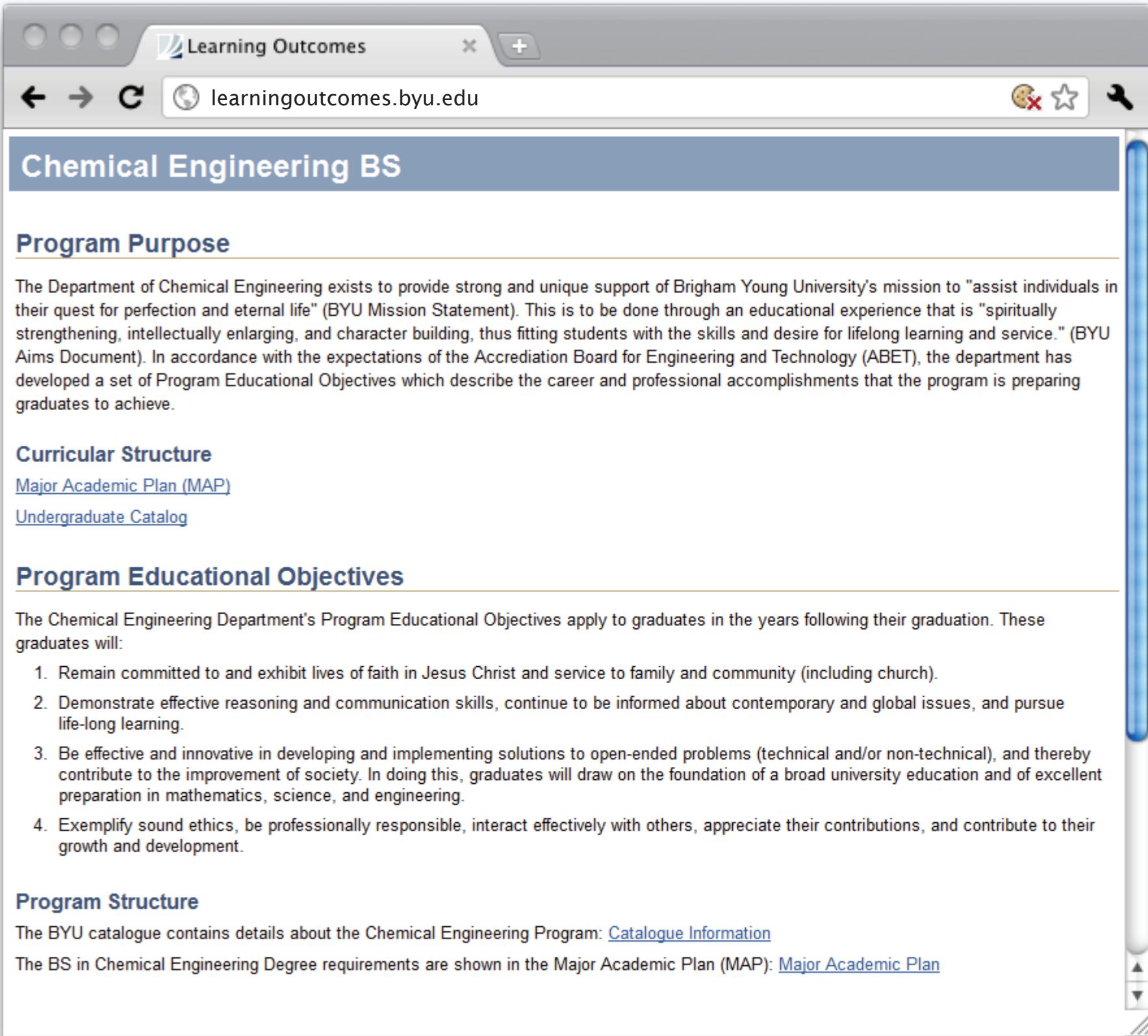


Goal: Link from Assessments up to University Outcomes

Original Web Site

A standard website controlled and edited by a single webmaster

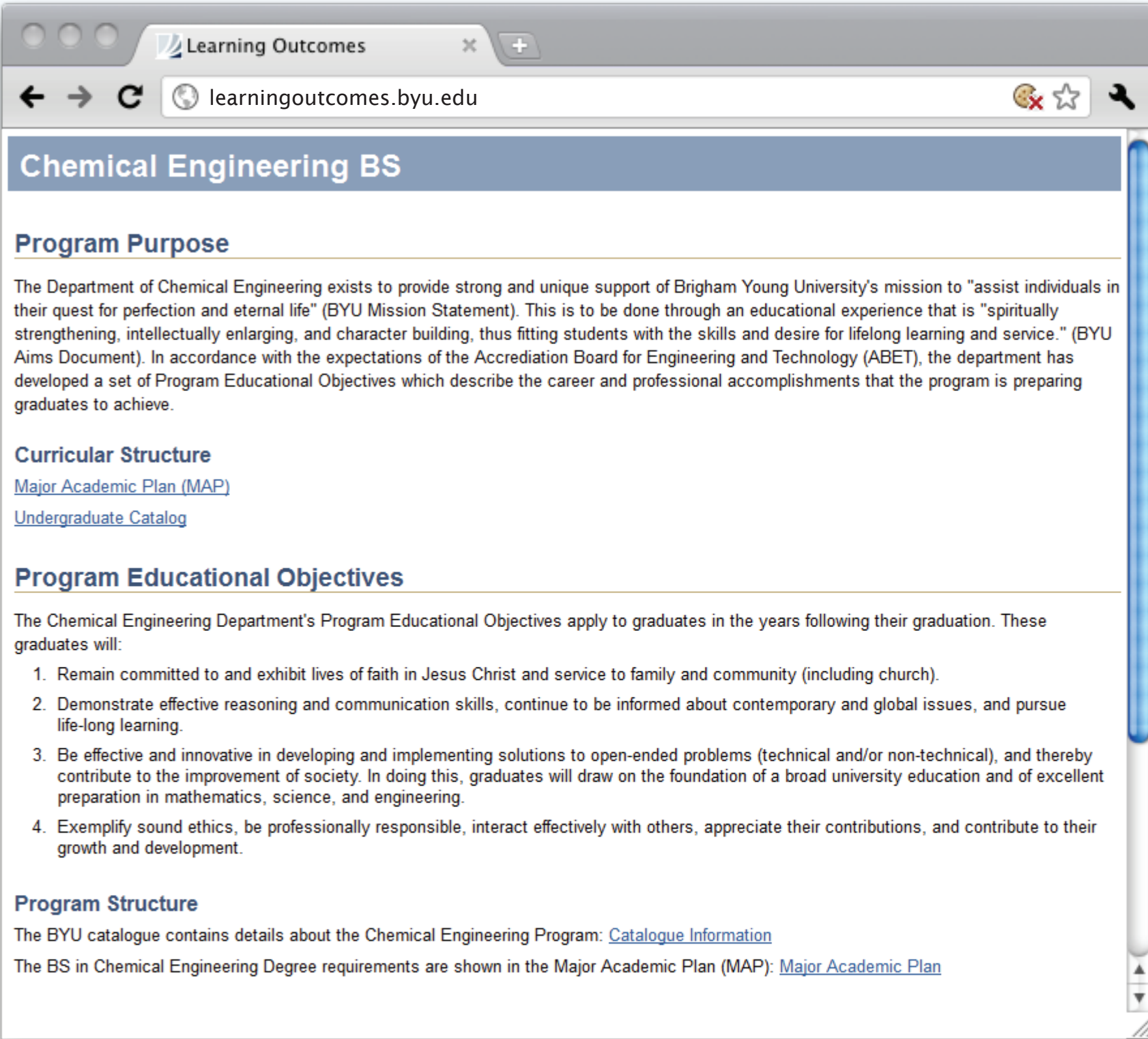
Transparency	Yes, for program outcomes
Accessibility	No, webmaster editing only
Functionality	Limited to viewing program outcomes
Benefits	Public visibility
Challenges	Webmaster editing bottleneck, no direct department control, no data on courses or “closing the loop”, information not sharable.



Media Wiki

A wiki site authored by department-designated editors

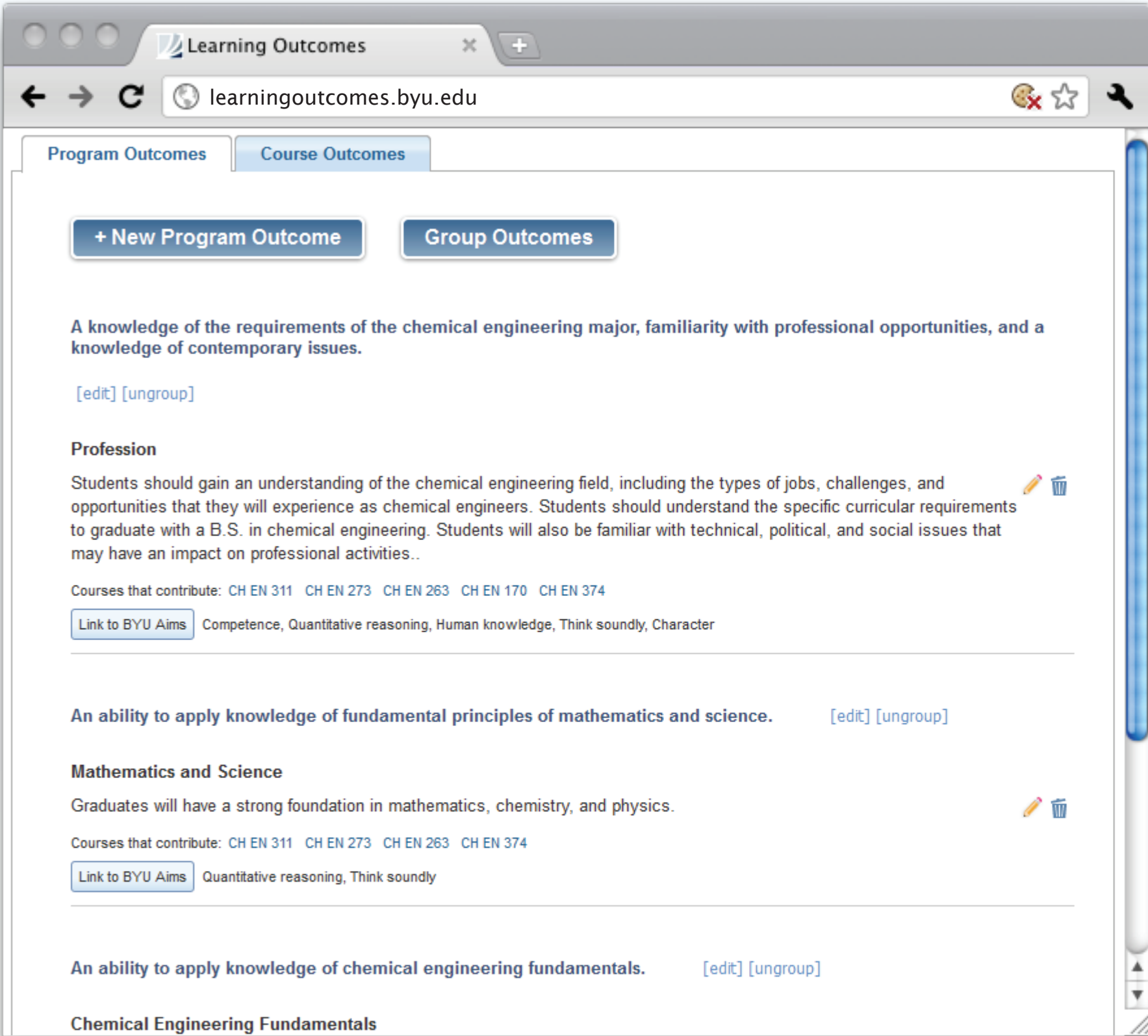
Transparency	Yes, for program outcomes
Accessibility	Yes, Department/Program editing
Functionality	Limited to program outcomes
Benefits	Department/program controlled, included new program alignment table (closing the loop)
Challenges	Data not sharable, no information on courses or program/course alignment, no ability for faculty share their individual course outcomes



Current Web Site

A custom-built site editable by department administrators and faculty.

Transparency	Yes, for program and course outcomes
Accessibility	Yes, Department/Program editing and individual faculty editing for own courses
Functionality	Post and link program and course outcomes
Benefits	Show and link program and course outcomes, service architecture so data is sharable
Challenges	Program orientation model makes entering outcomes for non-program courses difficult



BYU Learning Suite

An integrated learning management system built by and for BYU

Transparency	Yes, for program and course outcomes
Accessibility	Yes, individual faculty editing for own courses
Functionality	Post course outcomes and link to program outcomes
Benefits	Faculty can add course outcomes and link to program outcomes and assessments in their course
Challenges	Untested at this time
